Course Overview

This highly practical CLIL course is suitable for teachers of academic subjects in English. The course develops your language skills and examines CLIL methodology and terminology and how these relate to your teaching context, syllabus design, classroom activities and assessment.

Course Objectives

- develop your own language confidence and proficiency
- raise your understanding of CLIL methodology and key terms
- experience and explore a wide range of practical techniques and activities and understand course design and assessment from a CLIL perspective for use in your own classroom setting

Morning Programme (AM)

3 hours per day Monday-Friday (15 hours per week)

Our morning classes focus on language development and include work on reading, writing, listening, speaking, vocabulary development, grammar review and pronunciation. These take place in mixed-nationality General English classes suitable for each teacher's level.

Afternoon Programme (PM)

2 hours per day Monday-Thursday (8 hours per week)

Our afternoon classes are taught in a closed group as workshops and focus on developing an understanding of CLIL plus the design and use of classroom activities, assessment techniques and course design in the CLIL classroom.

Reflection Sessions

At the end of each day, you will have the opportunity as part of the timetable to reflect on what you have learned and how it can be incorporated into your own classroom context

Course Content

Before the course starts, we will ask you to complete a detailed needs analysis and indicate which sessions are of greatest value for you and your own students. Popular sessions include:

- An overview of CLIL principles
- Making the most of mobile devices (mobile phones and tablets) in the CLIL classroom
- Teaching and learning subject related vocabulary
- The importance of scaffolding in the CLIL classroom
- Peer teaching a CLIL lesson

Each course includes an afternoon embedded cultural visit per week which reflects the interests and needs of the group.

Erasmus + Funding
