Course Overview

This highly practical teacher refresher course is suitable for teachers of English (secondary and adult). The course develops your language skills and explores a wide range of classroom techniques and activities.

Course Objectives

- develop your own language confidence and proficiency
- work with a range of published English language teaching and authentic materials and understand how to maximise their use in your own teaching
- experience and explore engaging and practical classroom techniques and activities which you can take home for use in your own lessons

Morning Programme (AM)

3 hours per day Monday-Friday (15 hours per week)

Our morning classes focus on language development and include work on reading, writing, listening, speaking, vocabulary development, grammar review and pronunciation. These take place in mixed-nationality General English classes suitable for each teacher's level.

Afternoon Programme (PM)

2 hours per day Monday-Thursday (8 hours per week)

Our afternoon classes are taught in a closed group as workshops and focus on developing a range of techniques which can be used with your own classes plus an understanding of modern materials, both published and authentic.

Reflection Sessions

At the end of each day, you will have the opportunity as part of the timetable to reflect on what you have learned and how it can be incorporated into your own classroom context

Course Content

Before the course starts, we will ask you to complete a detailed needs analysis and indicate which sessions are of greatest value for you and your own students. Popular sessions include:

- Making the most of mobile devices (mobile phones and tablets)
- Getting low-level learners to speak
- Making grammar more engaging
- English as a lingua franca
- Teaching vocabulary
- Teaching pronunciation

Each course includes an afternoon embedded cultural visit per week which reflects the interests and needs of the group.

Erasmus + Funding

All CELT's teachers' courses are eligible for EU funding under KA1 (Individual Adult Mobility) of Erasmus +. You may therefore be able to apply for financial assistance using Erasmus +. The grant is given to the institution where you work and covers, tuition, accommodation, travel and subsistence.
